Overview

The FNRW began in July 2020 where 40+ Kenwood TK 380 radios were sold to residents of Fiddletown. The Red Mule Repeater served the community for emergency communication. However, coverage was spotty in some areas of town. A second repeater was installed in 2022 on Cobble Ridge, which successfully improved coverage for radio communication.

Bob Klienbrahm has served as "Net Control" since its inception, and continues to hold weekly radio check-ins on Wednesdays, at 7:00 pm.

- At the beginning of 2023 the radio network had 60 members.
- At the end of 2023 the radio network had 65 members.

Community Outreach and Fundraising

FNRW participated in the SmokeChasers Event with a table on May 20, 2023 at the Amador County Fairgrounds in collaboration with Lockwood Radio Network.

August 5, 2023, the FNRW Board Hosted a picnic for its members. It was well attended and supported our community building efforts.

The Annual Fiddlers Jam was held on September 17, 2023. Again, the FNRW had a table and promoted this program. "Swag, radios, and batteries were available for sale.

FNRW participated in Giving Tuesday at Drexel Hall. Proceeds from that event totaled: \$1905.12

Throughout the year FNRW has been recruiting members to serve as "Net Control" operators for Wednesday night check-ins. A few members have stepped up and a training session will occur in early 2024.

As fundraising allows, the Chair will stock radio inventory of radios, batteries, and charging stations, with a 10% markup.

Also, as fundraising allows, more equipment is needed for both the Red Mule and Cobble Ridge Repeaters. Technical Experts will submit requests for equipment by priority.

The FNRW End-of-Year Financial Report is attached. The goal is to maintain a minimum balance of \$500.
